II. Profit and Loss Prospects

The potential return on a Product is not limited, but dependent on the value of the Underlying, *i.e.* the investor benefits fully from an increase in the value of the Underlying over the term of the Product.

The potential loss associated with an investment in the Products is also dependent on the value of the Underlying. A negative performance of the Underlying may result in a loss for the investor. In addition, certain built-in costs are likely to adversely affect the market value of Products. The price at which the Issuer will be willing to purchase Products from a holder in secondary market transactions, if at all, will likely be lower than the original Issue Price.

Exposure to the performance of the Underlyings

Each Product will represent an investment linked to the performance of the Underlying(s) and potential investors should note that any amount(s) payable or other benefit to be received under the Products will generally depend upon the performance of the Underlying(s). The past performance of the Underlyings is not indicative of the future performance.

Secondary Market

Products may have no established trading market when issued and one may never develop. If a market does develop, it may not be liquid. Therefore, investors may not be able to sell their Products easily or at prices reasonably acceptable to them.

Under normal market circumstances, the Issuer will endeavour to provide a secondary market for Products, but is under no obligation to do so. Upon investor demand, the Issuer will endeavour to provide bid/offer prices for products, depending on actual market conditions. There will be a price difference between bid and offer prices (spread).

Early Redemption
