### Swiss Taxation

### Product Description

On the Final Redemption Date, if not early redeemed and if no Barrier Event has occurred, a Bonus Certificate is redeemed at a cash amount, which amount is dependent upon the performance of the Underlyings, but which will not be less than the product of the Denomination and the Conditional Protection. The Products enable the holder thereof to benefit from an unlimited participation in any positive performance of the Worst-Performing Underlying. So long as no Barrier Event has occurred, the Conditional Protection provides investors in the Products with a risk buffer.

Alternatively, if a Barrier Event has occurred, the Product no longer offers conditional protection and, consequently, the holder thereof can no longer expect to receive at least the product of the Denomination and the Conditional Protection on the Final Redemption Date, irrespective of the Underlying's performance. However, if in such case, the Final Level of each of the Underlyings is at or above the respective Strike, the holder may still benefit from any increase in the value of the Worst-Performing Underlying. If the value of the Underlyings develops unfavourably and a Barrier Event occurs, the Products directly reflect the negative performance of the Worst-Performing Underlying. Therefore, the risk associated with an investment in the Products is comparable to the risk associated with a direct investment in the Worst-Performing Underlying.

The Products provide for a continuous observation of the Barrier.

## II. Profit and Loss Prospects

The Products provide for an upside participation effect. The potential return on a Product is not capped.

The potential loss associated with an investment in such Products is linked to the negative performance of the Worst-Performing Underlying. If a Barrier Event occurs and the Final Level of one or

more of the Underlyings is below the respective Strike, the Products will be redeemed at a cash amount which will directly reflect such (negative) change in the value of the Worst-Performing Underlying and investors should be prepared to sustain a partial or total loss of their investment.

### III. Significant Risks for Investors

The following risk disclosure cannot disclose all the risks associated with an investment in the Products. #### 1. Issuer Risk

Investors bear the credit risk of the Issuer. The Products' retention of value is dependent not only on the development of the value of the Underlying, but also on the creditworthiness of the Issuer, which may change over the term of the Product. The credit rating of the Issuer is not a guarantee of credit quality. In case of the Issuer's insolvency or bankruptcy the investors in the Products may lose their entire investment.

#### 2. Product Risks

An investment in Products entails certain risks, which vary depending on the specific type and structure of the relevant Products and the relevant Underlying(s).

#### Risk of total loss

Products involve a high degree of risk, and prospective investors in the Products should recognise that, under certain circumstances, Products may have a redemption value of zero.

Prospective investors should therefore be prepared to sustain a partial or total loss of the amount of their investment therein.

#### **Unpredictable Market Value for Products**

During the term of a Product, the market value of, and the expected return on, such Product may be influenced by many factors, some or all of which may be unpredictable. Many economic and market factors will influence the market value of a Product. The Issuer expects that, generally, the value and volatility of the Underlying(s) on any day will affect the market value of such Product more than any other single factor. However, a potential investor should not expect the market value of a Product in the secondary market to vary in proportion to changes in the value of the Underlying(s). The return on a Product (if any) may bear little relation to, and may be much less than, the return that the investor therein might have achieved if such investor had invested directly in the Underlying(s).

The market value of, and return (if any) on, a Product will be affected by a number of other factors, which may be unpredictable or beyond the Issuer's control, and which may offset or magnify each other, including, without limitation:

- supply and demand for such Product, including inventory positions of any other market maker;
- the expected frequency and magnitude of changes in the market value of the Underlying(s) (volatility);
- economic, financial, political or regulatory events or judicial decisions that affect the Issuer, the Underlying(s) or the financial markets generally;
- interest and yield rates in the market generally;
- the time remaining until the Final Redemption Date;
- if applicable, the difference between the Level or Commodity Reference Price, as applicable, and the relevant threshold specified in the applicable Terms and Conditions;
- the Issuer's creditworthiness, including actual or anticipated downgrades in the Issuer's credit ratings; and
- dividend payments on the Underlying(s), if any.

Some or all of these factors may influence the price of a Product. The impact of any of the factors set forth above may enhance or offset some or all of any change resulting from another factor or factors.

In addition, certain built-in costs are likely to adversely affect the market value of Products. The price at which the Issuer will be willing to purchase Products from a holder in secondary market transactions, if at all, will likely be lower than the original Issue Price.

#### **Exposure to the performance of the Underlyings**

Each Product will represent an investment linked to the performance of the Underlying(s) and potential investors should note that any amount(s) payable or other benefit to be received under the Products will generally depend upon the performance of the Underlying(s). The past performance of the Underlyings is not indicative of the future performance.

#### **Exchange Rate Risk**

The Underlying(s) may be denominated in a currency other than that of the Issue Currency or, if applicable, the Settlement Currency for such Product, or the Underlying(s) may be denominated in a currency other than, or the Issue Currency or, if applicable, the Settlement Currency may not be, the currency of the home jurisdiction of the investor in such Product. #### **Secondary Market**

There will be a price difference between bid and offer prices (spread).

#### **Early Redemption**

The investors must be aware of a possible early redemption of the Product.

Upon the occurrence of an extraordinary event, the Calculation Agent and the Issuer, acting together, have the right to, among other things, early redeem the relevant Products. If the Issuer exercises such early redemption right(s), investors should be aware that the early redemption price may be considerably lower than the Issue Price (or, if different, the price the relevant investor paid for such product) and/or the Final Redemption Amount that would otherwise have been paid on the Final Redemption Date.

#### **Further product specific risks**

Investors should be aware that an investment in these Products generally results in a loss upon redemption if a Barrier Event has occurred and if the Final Level of one or more of the Underlyings is below the respective Strike. Consequently, the potential loss associated with an investment in such Products is linked to the negative performance of the Worst-Performing Underlying.
